



Float Cylinder– Commercial Air Travel Instructions

Your Float cylinder was designed with air travel in mind. Below are the steps you need to follow when flying with the major commercial airline providers in North America. The following steps apply for both checked or carry-on luggage. We recommend that you carry your empty Float cylinder onboard. This way, you can explain what it is to security personnel at the airport.

Step 1: Float cylinder must be empty when flying with major commercial airlines in North America. Release air from cylinder before arriving at the airport.*

*This is a great opportunity to practice deploying your Float system to become familiar with the location of the trigger and the pull force needed for deployment.

Step 2: Once cylinder is empty, un-thread the cylinder head from the cylinder.



Step 3: Place cylinder and cylinder head in a plastic bag to keep dirt and debris from contaminating sensitive areas. When carrying-on baggage, we recommend storage in a ski boot or padded area to avoid potential damage.
